Crisis-induced derogations from economic and social rights

Crisis-induced limitations to economic and social rights (not related to resources)

...invokes proportionality review + further review requirements: satisfaction of minimum core + non-discrimination + temporariness + necessity (least restrictive means)

> Crisis-induced retrogression on economic and social rights (due to resource constraints)

> > ...invokes (arguably weaker) reasonableness review (i.e. policy choice left to the state)

States' minimum core obligations

diverging views as to their absolute or relative, immediate or gradual, and enforceable or programmatic character - and as to their fixed or dynamic. universal or countryspecific content

States' accountability for regression on economic and social rights during structural crises compliant crises structural
